

REPORT OF THE 17th ANNUAL MEETING OF THE COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE (CC)

Alte Brücke Conference Centre, Swakopmund, NAMIBIA - 25 November 2024

1. Opening of the meeting

The 17th Annual Meeting of the SEAFO Compliance Committee (CC) was convened on the 25th November 2024 at the Alte Brücke Conference Centre in Swakopmund, Namibia. The Chairperson, Mr. Tae-hoon WON from the Republic of Korea, opened the meeting and welcomed the delegates.

2. Appointment of Rapporteur

The Secretariat was appointed as rapporteur for the meeting.

3. Adoption of Agenda and Meeting arrangements

The agenda (DOC/CC/01/2024) (Appendix I) was reviewed and adopted.

4. Introduction and Admission of Observers

The following Observers attended the meeting and were welcomed by the Chairperson:

- Mr. Michele AMERI from Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, United Nations Office of Legal Affairs (UN/DOALOS).
- Ms. Megan TIERNEY from The Agreement on the Conservation of Albatrosses and Petrels (ACAP). She is attending the SC and CC and Commission meeting. SEAFO has a MOU with ACAP which will be renewed in the 2024 Commission meeting.
- Mr. Xolela WELLEM from the Benguela Current Convention Secretariat based in Swakopmund, Namibia.

The Observers introduced themselves.

5. Introduction of Parties Delegations

Delegations introduced their members. See the delegate list in Appendix II.

6. Executive Secretary's Report on Compliance

The Compliance Review Report was presented by the Executive Secretary (ES) (DOC/CC/03/2024 Rev1 (23 Nov 24)). It was noted that two fishing trips, by the EU and Namibia, were conducted and included in the report.

A correction of date change was suggested in section 6 on page 3 to the report which is in red text and highlighted in yellow in the revised report (DOC/CC/03/2023/Rev2 (25 Nov 2024).

The EU promised to send quarterly catch report in time in future.

The CC appreciated new fishing activities and encouraged Namibia to improve the compliance by ensuring new vessels are compliant to all the requirements of SEAFO. Namibia committed to make sure that in future all compliance requirements are met.

The ES was requested to include the TAC information of all the SEAFO species in the report in future.

The CC emphasized the importance of getting the full details of lost gear in accordance with the requirements of SEAFO.

7. Annual Review of the "SEAFO System of Observation, Inspection, Compliance and Enforcement"

Japan proposed changes to the SEAFO System Article 24 (<u>DOC/CC/05/2024</u>). The CC discussed the proposal with several Contracting Parties providing their inputs. The Republic of South Africa submitted alternative text which will be reviewed by the CPs before the Commission meeting for discussion and possible adoption by the Commission.

ACTION: The CC postponed the matter to the Commission meeting of 2024.

8. Consideration of the provisional SEAFO IUU Vessel list for 2025

SEAFO has a joint listing agreement with NEAFC, NAFO, SIOFA and CCAMLR and the DRAFT IUU Vessel list contains the latest updates (DOC/CC/04/2024), which the CC approved and recommends that the Commission accept the SEAFO IUU vessel list for 2025.

ACTION: The CC adopted the DRAFT SEAFO IUU vessel list for 2025 and recommends to the Commission to approve the SEAFO IUU vessel list for 2025 presented in DOC/CC/04/2024.

9. Recommendations on Additional Measures of Compliance

South Africa proposed some areas of potential additional measures of Compliance. The CC encouraged all CPs to consider submitting proposals for additional measures of compliance to the next CC meeting where needed.

10. Any Other Matters

The CC discussed the matter of limiting Observers to attend discussions at the CC meetings where issues with sensitive information being discussed. The CC concluded that transparent engagement with Observers is important as it can contribute positively to SEAFOs mission and foster stronger global cooperation in combatting IUU fishing and promoting responsible fisheries management and to include Observers in the meetings on the condition that any CP could request a closed session in advance when they find an issue to be discussed in a closed format.

11. Venue and date of next meeting

The next Compliance Committee meeting will coincide with the next Commission meeting and the date will therefore be decided by the Commission.

12. Election of Chair and Vice-Chair

The term of the current Chair and Vice-Chairperson came to an end and in accordance with the rotational rule, The Republic of Namibia will be the Chair, and the Republic of South Africa will be the Vice-Chair for the period 2025-2026. Names of persons for the positions will be submitted to the ES as soon as possible.

13. Adoption of the 2024 Compliance Committee Report

The meeting reviewed and adopted the Compliance Committee report for 2024 to be presented by the Chair to the Commission.

14. Closure of meeting

The Chair closed the meeting at 13:37 on the 25th of November 2024 and adjourned the meeting in good faith.
