1. Opening of the meeting

6. Executive Secretary's Report on Compliance

The Executive Secretary will present a report on compliance for 2017. The Committee will discuss the Compliance Report and make recommendation on issues emanating from the report (DOC/CC/03/2017).

6.1 Discussion on the vessel Argos Marine case.

Namibia will have the opportunity to present the case and answer questions.

7. Annual Review of the "SYSTEM"

The SYSTEM was adopted in 2013. The "SYSTEM" (DOC/CC/04/2017) is a living document and there is a need to review its content annually. Norway submitted proposed changes to the System to be discussed during the meeting (DOC/CC/05/2016).

8. Consideration of the provisional SEAFO IUU Vessel list cf. SEAFO "SYSTEM"

SEAFO has a joint listing agreement with NEAFC, NAFO and CCAMLR and the PROVISIONAL IUU Vessel list contains the latest updates (DOC/CC/06/2016).

One vessel was added to the Provisional list after being reported by the EU. The authorities of the Flag country (Bolivia) was informed of the inclusion. Correspondence on the case can be seen in <u>DOC/CC/07/2017</u> and other Supporting Documents in <u>DOC/CC/08/2017</u>.

The Committee shall adopt the provisional IUU Vessel list.

9. Recommendation on additional Measures of Compliance

The Committee will consider any other compliance-related measures for recommendation to the Commission if needed.

10. Review of Recommendations from 2nd Performance Review (2016)

10.1 If the fishing activity in the Convention Area sharply increases, the Commission should also examine the possibility to develop within the Compliance Committee an annual country by country compliance review complementary to the annual Compliance Committee compliance performance review undertaken on the basis of measure by measure assessments.

ACTION: EU committed to submit a proposal for Country by Country Compliance Review Process.

10.2 South Africa identified a need to enhance compliance levels and therefore request that training be provided by SEAFO, costs which are to be borne by SEAFO. It is estimated that training costs would be approximately 30,000 ZAR. South Africa therefore request that these funds be provided for training similar to that provided to Scientific Committee by SEAFO.

ACTION: The Commission endorsed the amount of N\$ 30,000.00 for training on request from South Africa.
